### RECOMMENDED CULTIVARS/SPECIES

""Summel Pastels' Mix, 'Little Moonshine'

Yarrow is an easy perennial, growing in nearly any sunny situation, even where there is poor soil. Plants form low mounds of fragrant ferny foliage, with clusters of flowers on upright stems. Cultivars are less invasive than the species.



# Hyssop Hummingbird mint

### Agastache spp.

### RECOMMENDED CULTIVARS/SPECIES

Agastache auriantiaca CORONADO® 'P012S', Agastache cana SONORAN SUNSET®, Agastache rupestris, Agastache KUDOS™ series, 'Blue Fortune', Agastache rugosa 'Korean Zest', 'Peachie Keen'

These showy, minty-fragrant, long-blooming perennials are highly attractive to hummingbirds and pollinators. The best Agastaches for our area are the cultivars derived from our native species from the U.S. Southwest. They thrive in hot, dry, sunny areas and need well-drained soil

and feature large blooms in shades of red, orange, and pink. European Agastache hybrids are more often blue flowered and some are well-adapted for our area.

RECOMMENDED CULTIVARS/SPECIES n/a

An upright, clump-forming plant that features attractive, narrow, woolly, silver-gray foliage and tiny, white, globular flowers with yellow center stamens arranged in flattish clusters. Flower heads are valued for dried flower arrangements.

""Blackhawks' PP27949, WINDWALKER® 'PWIN01S', 'Rain Dance,' 'Red October'

The striking, tall foliage of 'Blackhawks' emerges deep green to dark purple in spring and deepens to near black. Dubbed the "monarch of the prairie," this native grass was once the dominant component of the American tallgrass prairie. It adapts easily to a wide range of soil and

moisture conditions as long as full sun is provided. This long-lived grass has a variety of uses including screening, naturalizing, and wildlife habitat.

A native of Africa, this annual tolerates heat, sun, and drought, and its large flowers with dark centers bloom until frost and attracts a variety of pollinators. This daisy has silver-tinged foliage that is finely lobed and silky in appearance.



# Mossy sandwort Desert moss

""Wallowa Mountain'

Achieve the look of bright green moss with this **evergreen** desert arenaria. Its vibrant color continues from spring until cold arrives in later fall. A great option for edging pavers and rock gardens.

# Southernwood

### Artemesia abrotanum

This ancient European garden herb is a cousin of our native sagebrush, Southernwood shares its tolerance for dry conditions! With a woodsy, citrusy smell and fine, ferny silver-green foliage, Southernwood can be a star in the landscape. Sheers well - use it in place of boxwood to create a heat-loving hedge.

# Narrowleafmilkweed

### Asclepias fascicularis

RECOMMENDED CULTIVARS/SPECIES n/a

This milkweed can be found across the western states and it is common in the Boise Foothills. It is a very important plant for monarch butterflies. It is adapted to dry locations, but can be found in a variety of habitats. It spreads via rhizomes as well as by seed. It has long, narrow leaves and



produces tight clusters of greenish-white to pink-purple flowers. Its seed pods are long and slim and the silky seeds are about 1/4 inch long.



# Showy milkweed

### Asclepias speciosa

### RECOMMENDED CULTIVARS/SPECIES

n/a

Showy milkweed occurs in the central U.S. and westward. Its abundance helps make it one of the most important milkweed species for monarch butterflies. It can be an aggressive spreader, forming large colonies due to its ability to reproduce vegetatively. It has large ovate, gray-green

leaves and its stems and leaves contain milky sap. Its large seed pods split open in the fall to release papery seeds with silky hairs attached.

# Butterfly milkweed

### Asclepias tuberosa

RECOMMENDED CULTIVARS/SPECIES n/a

Butterfly milkweed is an important plant for butterfly larvae, including Monarchs. Adult butterflies also appreciate the bright orange nectar-filled flowers. Green seed pods open to silky seeds. This milkweed is without the milky sap found in other milkweed. Requires little care once established.

# Chocolate flower

### Berlandiera lyrata

RECOMMENDED CULTIVARS/SPECIES

This native southwest wildflower produces a continuous succession of dark-eyed, yellow daisies over a compact rosette of foliage. The flowers exude a rich chocolate aroma in the morning hours. Cut back in summer to keep plants from sprawling and to encourage longer blooming. Will reseed if allowed.

A medium sized tree that is slow growing with a spreading habit, providing cover for wildlife. It has a long life span and is adaptable to gardens as well as urban landscapes. Reddish to purple fruit are edible and also provide food for birds.



# Eastern redbud Judas tree

""Forest Pansy,' 'Hearts of Gold,' THE RISING SUN™, ' Little Woody,' FLAME THROWER®

Small to medium sized tree in the pea family with striking purple blooms up and down bare trunk and branches in early spring. Attracts pollinators and songbirds love the bean pod fruits. They have distinctive heart shaped leaves. This tree is sensitive to drought, heat, and lawn chemicals.

This plant is a long blooming ground cover with a dense mat of **evergreen**, succulent foliage. Good for containers, rock gardens, rock walls and for edging. Grows best in full sun with moderate moisture in dry summers. Does not like bark mulch; gravel is a better option.

# Ginkgo Maidenhair Tree

This is one of the toughest and most adaptable trees, derived from an ancient plant species. It grows slowly but eventually reaches over 50 feet tall and has a pyramidal or columnar form. Its characteristic fan-shaped leaves turn golden in the fall. Despite its deciduous nature, it is related to conifers. Therefore, it doesn't produce flowers or fruits, although It does produce fruit-like seeds.

# Roundleaf coralbells Alumroot

This northwest native plant forms an attractive mound of green foliage made up of oval to heartshaped leaves with scalloped margins. In late spring, slender, leafless flower stalks grow upright from the center of the plant. The inflorescence is a dense cluster of small flowers. Heucheras are a cheery addition to a dry shade garden and require very little maintenance.

## RECOMMENDED CULTIVARS/SPECIES

Teucrium is a fairly large genus of evergreen shrubs and subshrubs that includes species ranging from low perennial tufts to the nearly 8-ft. tall bush germander. Commonly called Germander, they are native to the Mediterranean area and all species are fairly drought tolerant and thrive in heat, in poor or rocky soils, and in other difficult situations. In rich garden loam, they may become

lush and somewhat rangy. They can be left to develop a casual, natural shape or be sheared into formal topiaries or hedges. The most common germanders found in the garden trade are Teucrium chamaedrys (wall germander), T. fruticans (bush germander), T. cossonii (Grey creeping or fruity germander).
